- 1.) Discussion on the conference thus far:
 - a. Everyone mentioned it is a friendly environment and it is easy to talk to people.
 - b. It feels like a non-competitive or non-toxic performance environment
- 2.) Discussion on "What do you feel your education has prepared you for? What do you feel you're unprepared for?":
 - a. Some have expressed confidence in rehearsing ensembles because their graduate assistantship gave them that opportunity.
 - b. General feeling of not being ready for administrative paperwork due to a lack of doing such.
 - c. Some expressed confidence and proficiency with notation software
 - d. Some stated lack of preparedness to teach drum set or world percussion.
 - e. Some stated they felt very well rounded.
 - f. Some don't feel ready to program diverse composers due to recycling pieces every few years.
 - g. Large dislike for music history because it doesn't seem relevant to our instrument
- 3.) Discussion on "What value does our work have outside of academia":
 - a. Collaboration with other departments or arts as a way of exposure
 - b. Some felt disheartened that their work failed to mean anything to others
 - c. Some expressed our work would have more value if more people knew about it
- 4.) Discussion on "Recreational music"
 - a. Some expressed that it had been a long time since music was played just for fun. Music is fun but had not been done recreationally in a while.
